

UNIFORM AND THAN-PHONG LOGO, PATCH, AND BELT SYSTEM

- Uniform: white v-neck uniform for all students from beginner to 2nd Kup Red Belt. However, the Red Belt has an option to wear a Red trim around the V-neck. All Black Belts wears Black trim V-neck up to 9th Dan. From 3-Dan to 6-Dan, wear 2 additional parallel on both sides of top and bottom (from shoulder to the end of sleeves and from top to the bottom of pants). From 7-Dan and higher wear 3 additional parallel 6" black stripes on both sides of shoulder and pant.
- All uniforms must have WTF Logo on the left of the chest and Than-Phong Logo on the right. On the back is the Than-Phong Patch.
- Belt system: There are 5 Colors and 10 levels of ranking system, start from 10th (beginner) to Embroidered Belt (highest color rank):
 - White Belt = 10th (Beginner); Yellow = 8D; Green = 6D; Blue = 4D; Red = 2D;
 - White w/1 Yellow stripe = 9R; Yellow w/1 Green stripe = 7R; Green w/1 Blue stripe = 5R; Blue w/1 Red stripe = 3R; Red w/1 Black stripe = 1R;
 - White w/2 Yellow stripes = 9D, Yellow w/2 Green stripes = 7D; Green w/2 stripes = 5D; Blue w/2 Red stripes = 3D; Red w/2 Black stripes = 1D;
 - White w/3 Yellow stripes = 8R; Yellow w/3 Green stripes = 6R; Green w/3 Blue stripes = 4R; Blue w/3 Red stripes = 2R; Red w/3 Black stripes = Embroidered Belt.
 - Black Belt: 9 Dan start from 1st to 9th represented by Gold Bar.

THE MEANING OF THE THAN-PHONG LOGO AND PATCH

- The Circle represents the Universe. There are opposite but complimentary matters that exist in every aspect of the universe and the human life, such as day and night, hot and cold, rain and sunshine, strong and weak, male and female, etc...
- The Right Fist represents the Taekwondo style. It also represents power and justice
- The Wings are in the logo of the Viet Nam Air Force of the previous regime where Than-Phong was founded.
- The color White is a symbol of purity. The disciples of Than-Phong TKD live their life with purity physically, mentally, in words and in action.
- The color Yellow represents the skin of Oriental people, where TKD was found.
- The color Red represents Yang which symbolizes Heat, strength, success, and day.
- The color Blue represents Yin which symbolizes Ocean, cold, hope, and night
